In the wake of a recent tragedy within our community, the Surprise Fire-Medical Department is urging residents to prioritize home fire safety and preparedness. The incident involved the unfortunate loss of a community member who was deaf/hard of hearing in a house fire. While the home's smoke alarms sounded, the resident did not hear them and, therefore, did not evacuate. This heartbreaking incident has underscored the critical importance of getting safety information into the hands of our residents, especially those with functional considerations.

THE SURPRISE FIRE-MEDICAL DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING FIRE SAFETY PRACTICES:



INSTALL SMOKE ALARMS/ SPECIALIZED ALARMS

Install in every bedroom, outside of each sleeping area, and on every level of the home. Consider installing smoke alarms designed for individuals with hearing impairments. These alarms utilize strobe lights and vibrations to alert residents in case of fire. Visit the website listed below to learn about free resources.



KNOW THE RISKS & STAY INFOMED

Regularly review and update your knowledge on common fire hazards and fire safety tips to ensure the well-being of your household. Knowledge is a powerful tool in preventing and responding to emergencies. Visit the website listed below for fire safety videos in ASL.



CREATE AN EMERGENCY PLAN

Develop a household emergency plan. Account for the specific needs of all family members. Regularly practice evacuation routes and communication methods. Share this emergency plan with trusted neighbors and loved ones who could assist you or provide information to responders during an emergency. Closing Up Your Home

In the event you are away for an extended time, please note the following instructions.

- Emergency contact make sure you have an emergency contact in case of emergencies. (Water leaks, etc.)
- Close all blinds.
- Refrigerator/Ice Maker Turn off water to the ice maker so there is not a build-up of ice cubes. If the refrigerator is turned off, leave the refrigerator door partially open.
- Dishwasher Close door, but DO NOT LATCH OR LOCK IN POSITION. Close all drains to help eliminate any sewer gases from coming back up into your home because of lack of use. Put about 1 Tablespoon vegetable oil in the dishwasher (do not latch)
- Garbage Disposal After the last of the water is run, pour ½ to ¾ cup of salad oil in the disposal to keep the blades lubricated and prevent the small amount of moisture that is always present on the bottom from causing rust.
- Washing Machine Shut off washer box valve in laundry room or garage area to relieve pressure to the hose.
- **Toilets** lift lids and stretch Saran Wrap tightly over the bowl to keep the trap from drying out. Close water supply valve under tank.
- Cover furniture
- Hot Water Heater Follow shut-down instructions in the water heater manual for proper progress of shut-down steps. (it's not necessary to drain the water heater) or you can turn your hot water heater to pilot.



- Thermostat We recommend leaving your thermostat set at 85 (summer) and 55 (winter).
- Check furnace filters to make sure they are clean before leaving.
- To keep moisture in the house during the very hot, dry summer

 place towels in the sinks and bathtub/shower pan and set pails
 of water on top of these. Pails should not be set directly on tile or
 carpet. DO NOT FILL UP YOUR SINKS AND TUB WITH WATER. THIS
 MAY CAUSE DAMAGE.
- Patio furniture place grill and patio furniture in garage
- Garage Door Opener Be sure the switch is in the OFF position.
- Check irrigation and water clock change battery if it is time. Check for weeds and mitigate, if necessary.
- Disconnect car battery.
- Front Hose Bib Shut off main house valve, which is located under the front hose bib.
- Surprise Police also recommend that you lock up everything and then leave by the front door to make sure it is locked.
- If you see an open front door/garage door for one of your neighbors, contact the Surprise Police at 623-222-4000.
- Some owners hire a house sitter to come in and flush the toilets and run the water every couple of weeks so that everything stays running smoothly.
