
### It's Time to Vote. Your Vote Counts

In the upcoming primary election there's more on the ballot than who is going to run for Mayor. (Our own Aly Cline is running for Mayor against an opponent.). There are also some important

propositions being addressed that are worth your time and attention.

By now all registered Arizona voters have received a two part post card in the mail affirming your voting information. Do nothing if there are no changes. But, if you are going to be away on July 3rd and want



your mail-in ballot to be sent to another address, you must respond.

Election Day in Surprise is July 30. Don't let your Vote be wasted.


The Desert is A-Bloom, and so is La Solana
